[1] *Partial Birth Abortion Ban- HB2769*: Would ban partial-birth abortion in Arizona. **Passed House 34-25. Passed Senate 21-9. Vetoed by the Governor. (CAP-Supported Bill)**

[2] *Partial Birth Abortion Ban- SB 1048*: Would ban partial-birth abortion in Arizona. Addressed the concerns listed in the Governor's veto of HB2769. **Passed Senate 18-6. Passed House 34-19. Vetoed by the Governor. (CAP-Supported Bill)**

[3] *Parental Consent for Abortion -HB 2263*: Would put in state statute guidelines already issued by a state appellate court for a judge to consider when deciding whether to allow a minor to get an abortion without parental consent. **Passed House 32-27. Passed Senate 18-12. Vetoed by the Governor. (CAP-Supported Bill)**

[4] *Nurses Performing Abortions- HB 2269*: Would prohibit nurses from performing surgical abortions. **Passed House 32-28. Failed in Senate 14-12. (CAP-Supported Bill)**

[5] *Jesse's Law- HB 2823*: Clarifies law in circumstances where food and fluid is removed from patients that are unable to communicate. **Passed House 39-19. Passed Senate 17-9. Signed by the Governor. (CAP-Supported Bill)**

[6] *Marriage Referendum- SCR 1042*: Places amendment to the state constitution on the November ballot to define marriage as the union of one man and one woman. **Passed Senate 16-4. Passed House 32-25. Transmitted to the Secretary of State. (CAP-Supported Bill)**

[7] *Premium Tax Credit for STO Contributions- HB 2099*: Would amend corporate scholarship tax credit program to enable insurance companies to support school choice programs. **Passed House 32-27. Failed in Senate 14-7. (CAP-Supported Bill)**

[8] *Amendment to Repeal School Choice Tax Credit Programs- HB 2094*: Would amend the bill to repeal scholarship tax credit programs that enable students to attend private schools chosen by their parents. **Failed in Senate 10-14. (CAP-Opposed Measure)**

[9] *Bullying and Harassment Amendment to Student's Religious Liberties Act- HB 2713*: Would amend the Student's Religious Liberties Act to state that schools may deem religious expression as bullying or harassment if it offends another student. **Failed in Senate 7-14. (CAP-Opposed Measure)**

[10] *Student Religious Liberties Act- HB 2713*: Would place in state statute the constitutional rights that students have to express religious viewpoints in class, academic work, and through clothing or jewelry. **Passed House 36-23. Passed Senate 16-10. HB 2713 did not reach the Governor's desk because the session ended before House could give final approval. (CAP-Supported Bill)**

[11] *Internet Age Misrepresentation- HB 2129*: Makes it a felony to misrepresent one's age on the internet for the purpose of committing a sexual offense against a minor. **Passed House 55-0. Passed Senate 28-0. Signed by the Governor. (CAP-Supported Bill)**

[12] *General Budget for Fiscal Year 2009- HB 2209*: Removes funding for all social conservative items from the state's budget, including abstinence education, voucher programs, pregnancy center grants, and marriage skills training grants. **Passed House 31-29. Passed Senate 16-10. Signed by the Governor. (CAP-Opposed Bill)**

[13] *Education Budget for fiscal year 2009- HB 2211*: Expands the Arizona Lottery to pay for university capital improvement and other state programs. **Passed House 31-29. Passed Senate 16-10. Signed by the Governor. (CAP-Opposed Bill)**
